This years programme introduced several works never sung by the choir before; the spectacular "Nova Nova" by Chilcott, and the more traditional "Jacob's Ladder" arranged by Darlington. A number of carols not St heard in Bartholomew's recently were also included in the programme; People look East (Traditional) and Personent Hodie (Holst).
