Web Site Report

Visitors to the parish web site have been increasing at a steady rate in the last few months. Most days we welcome more than 30 visitors per day, and some days we see as many as 75 visitors in a 24 hour period. Site statistics show that most of these visitors are exploring through different parts of the site to see what we have to offer.

Three Organ pieces were recorded for the parish web site during the month of March, performed by Malcolm Wisener, David Falconer, and Andrew Mackriell. The three tracks were recorded by Richard Bannister, and between them have seen over 300

downloads so far from over 20 different countries, including some you might expect (Ireland, Japan, USA), and many you might not (Peru, Iceland, Croatia, and the Dominican Republic).

Other recent additions include photographs of the Girls choir, some photographs of the choir wearing Mortarboards (c. 1900), a page about the Vale Psalter in use at St Bartholomew's, and a page about the Liturgy in St Bartholomew's. Trumpet Fanfare

Throughout the rebuild of the Organ, we have been very lucky to have Professor Gerard Gillen reporting to the vestry about the progress made. In his final report, Professor Gillen commented that our instrument was now one of the finest in the country. He felt, however, that the absolute icing on the cake would be the addition of a fanfare trumpet stop of some kind.

The vestry decided to follow the professor's advice. The total cost of the additional stop will be approximately 15,000 Euro. There is a certain amount of money remaining in the Organ fund, however it will be necessary to run some fund raising events to make up the balance. Any help and suggestions in this regard would be very welcome.

Chester Trip

The choir takes off on its journey to Chester on Tuesday April 22nd, returning very late in the evening on Sunday April 27th. As always we will be singing a full compliment of services during the week, with Evensong each day and of course the Eucharist on Sunday morning.

We have been invited to attend a Civic Reception on Thursday 24th in the Town Hall, where we will be received by the Lord Mayor of the City of Chester, Councillor Brian Crowe. St Bartholomew's Choir will carry with it a letter of greeting from the Lord Mayor of Dublin, Councillor Dermot Lacey.

Following an extremely successful inaugural concert some time back, the AIB Choral Society will be performing a second concert in the church on Saturday June 7th. The society is run out of the AIB headquarters which are just around the corner from the church, and it is directed by former chorister Bruce Middleton.

The Easter Vestry takes place this year in the church on Sunday May 4th at 1:00pm. This annual meeting is very important in the life of the parish. The past year is reported on and a new select vestry is voted in to look after the church for the next year. Those who are recorded on the parish register are entitled to vote, and if they so wish, to be put forward for office.

Landmines Concert

Trinity College Singers, the Palestrina Choir, the Gaudete Singers, the Trinity College Chapel Choir, and the Mornington Singers to sing the Faure Requiem in a charity concert on Saturday 1st March.

The concert, given to a capacity crowd, was presented by Brian Dobson. The money raised from the event will finance the clearance of a minefield in Donji Vakuf, a village near Semestica in central Bosnia Herzegovina.
