connection, Charles Wood's rousing anthem "O thou the central Orb". Wood was born in Armagh, where his father was a Vicar Choral in the Cathedral. The main choral work in the programme will be William Byrd's setting of the Mass for five voices, and there will be organ interludes played on the new Klais organ.

The two choirs move south of the River Thames on Thursday, 20th April to sing Choral Evensong at Southwark Cathedral at 5:00pm. The music for this service will include the Second Service by William Byrd, and the motet "Cantique de Jean Racine" by Gabriel Fauré. On Saturday, 22nd April the venue is the magnificent Westminster Abbey. The choirs will sing Choral Evensong at 3:00pm. The service setting of Dyson in D, and the motet "Blessed be the God and Father" by Samuel Sebastian Wesley, will be sung by the united choir of some 30 boy choristers and 20 gentlemen.

In advance of the trip, the two choirs will combine for an evensong in St Patrick's Cathedral on Sunday, 12th March at 3:15pm. The service setting on this occasion will be as for the Southwark Evensong; Second Service by William Byrd and the motet "Cantique de Jean Racine" by Gabriel Fauré. *Robin Heather*
